Hello and Happy holidays to everyone.

Well, after many hours of staring blankly at my computer screen, hands on the keyboard I have finally completed my first River Debris news letter. I knew following in the footsteps of Brad Knapp was not going to be easy task since he did such a fine job as Commodore and made it all look easy.

Brad thanks again for your years of hard work on the board and your continuing support and guidance as I assume the GRSC Commodore duties.

Now on to the newsletter. The I-LYA (Inter-Lake Yacht Association) meeting was held the first weekend in December with some interesting and important items to report. Rob Mock sent me a very well written, informative email summarizing the I-LYA meeting discussions/decisions for 2010. (WOW, 2010 already!) Instead of me plagiarizing Rob's email to me, I have included below.

The good news is Bay week is going to adopt a Friday, Saturday, Sunday format similar to the Noods, instead of the Monday-Wednesday schedule. Bay Week dates are the 6-8 of August with the deep water from Cleveland on Wednesday August 4th. The first race on Friday will have a 10:30 start instead of the grueling 8am dock time. The reasoning behind this is to allow crew to catch the first ferry/jet express to the Island Friday morning to alleviate having to spend an extra night at one of the Island's fine roach coaches. A lodging package is being put together along with possible discounts (a first) and the dockage which has been a problem in years past is close to being resolved. Race Management is also going to improve as well, Ron Specie from GIYC, who ran the J 105 GLCs two years ago will be RC on one course and Jim Tige, has offered to come back and help with One Design. Also for the PHRF fleets, instead of the long around the Islands races that turn into endurance drifters, they intend to schedule two shorter races that will incorporate the Islands as one of the turning marks. Ideally there could be two different courses /races as the wind changes or if there is a lack of wind the fleet will not be out all day drifting.

An on line questionnaire was sent from ILYA to sailing club delegates back in November and the response was overwhelming, with one of the highest returns ILYA has ever received to any of their questionnaires. The sweeping changes are the result of the questionnaire; the sailors have spoken and have been heard. ILYA and Lake Yacht racing Association, (LYRA) Lake Ontario's version of our ILYA are discussing LYRA having an event in the eastern end of Lake Erie (read bring Lake Ontario sailboats to lake Erie) that will dovetail into a stop over in Buffalo and Cleveland and the Cleveland Deep water race and bay week. Early speculations indicate that 200 boats are possible.
