#### From Vice Commodore Todd:

On Wednesday, March 16<sup>th</sup> Ryan Hoffman and I visited Chagrin Lagoons Yacht Club, and discussed with members of CLYC and Northeast Yacht Club the possibility of setting up some races between our clubs. Both clubs have fleets similar to GRSC; currently comprised of a few boats that travel to regattas, but with the majority involved only in more casual club racing and cruising.

From the meeting, it was decided that on Saturday, June 18<sup>th</sup> transport races from NEYC and GRSC would be set-up, and Chagrin Lagoons would then host a round-the-buoys race in the late-afternoon/early-evening. Free overnight dockage and a get-together cook-out would be provided at CLYC. Return races to the home clubs would be scheduled on Fathers Day morning; Sunday, June 19<sup>th</sup>.

Grand River to Chagrin River is only approximately nine nautical miles, with CLYC centrally located between GRSC and NEYC. This also would be an

opportunity to include several boats from The Mentor Harbor Yacht Club that have expressed interest in racing with our fleet.

The specific race management and scoring details will be worked-out, but the three separate races could be combined into a series for the GRSC fleet. (However, as the Saturday afternoon race would be considered an invitational race, any boat without a valid PHRF certificate may be separately scored or assigned a 10-second penalty by CLYC.)

This was determined to be the best available weekend for several reasons. The consensus received from the GRSC racing fleet was that Fathers Day should not be included as part our Sunday Spring Series, and NEYC does not have any club races scheduled on this holiday weekend. These races would not directly compete with any CSA regatta (except Cleveland Race Week One-Design), and may even serve as tune-up and feeder races for any boats that may continue on to participate at Edgewater Yacht Club's Cleveland Race Week the following week.

CLYC has discontinued co-hosting the annual Fall Markko Cup race to Ashtabula, and in exchange for hosting this weekend is very interested in participating in our now annual September Geneva Race Weekend.

The attached preliminary GRSC calendar has been amended to include these additional races, and will be finalized and presented at the April 2<sup>nd</sup> Membership Meeting.

Also attached is a flyer for CLYC's 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Swap Meet on April 30<sup>th</sup>.

#### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

Attached is a copy of the Lake-Metro Parks volunteers' newsletter with details on how to help out the sailing and small-boat training classes at Fairport Harbor this year. Several GRSC members have volunteered throughout the years, but the park is currently in need of additional instructors.
