### **COMMODORE'S COLUMN:**

### 2012 GRSC FALL MEMBERSHIP MEETING - NOVEMBER 10TH

The 2012 GRSC Fall Membership Meeting and Awards Banquet is slated for Saturday evening, November 10<sup>th</sup>, at the Grand River Yacht Club.

For the last four years we have combined these two events. Prior to that, the Membership Meeting was held in October and the Awards Banquet later in the year. To hold the Membership Meeting in November instead of October will require a change to the GRSC Code of Regulations. The 2012 Board has voted to present this change to the membership at this time so that we can formally incorporate it at next Tuesday's Board of Trustees Meeting.

The reason we are requesting that we be allowed to be hold the meeting in October <u>OR</u> November is that October is normally a very busy time of the year for most boaters; a time when we're trying to get that last cruise in, pulling and cleaning the marks, and ultimately pulling and winterizing the boats. This will also afford us more time to acquire nominations for next year's open board positions, prepare the trophies, acquire worthy awards, and organize the party.

If anyone has an objection to changing the regulations or having this year's event conducted the second Saturday in November, please let us know before or during next Tuesday's board meeting.

## **NOMINEES NEEDED**

Mike Nolan, as the immediate Past Commodore, has already started soliciting nominees for next year's open GRSC board and officer positions. All positions are open for nominations.

Regrettably, we have recently been advised that Sandy Woodthorpe will not be able to serve as our 2013 GRSC Commodore due to other personal conflicts and constraints. Sandy has served this club admirably for the past two years, and has implemented numerous marketing, publicity, educational, and other communication and social media improvements. Sandy will be missed as Commodore, but it is hoped that she may continue to offer her leadership and support in these other important areas.

Over the past several years we have made significant strides in increasing membership, event participation, and club offerings. In order to maintain this trend, we need volunteers willing to help. If interested and willing, please contact Mike Nolan or any of this year's board members.

### **2012 GRSC REGATTA**

Through the concerted efforts of many volunteers, contributors, and supporters; this year's GRSC regatta can only be considered a huge and tremendous success. Through these efforts, we were able to provide more than three days of great racing, great entertainment, great food, and a well-organized and professionally ran event.

Racing fleet participation increased at this year's regatta. This may be attributed to a variety of reasons that included an increase in marketing efforts, with flyers distributed electronically via the website and Facebook, and posted at nearly all prior 2012 Cleveland Sailing Association (CSA) events; the convenience afforded by having the Mentor Harbor regatta rescheduled to the weekend after the Falcon Cup; or the establishment of a feeder race from MHYC to GRSC. Whatever the reason(s), the combined big boat classes experienced a 20% increase in participation, and the dinghy fleet increased by more than 100%. Participation also increased off the water, with more attendees, volunteers, and many more financial contributors.

A preliminary accounting review reflects that we made over \$2,400.00. The majority of this will be donated to the Cleveland Sight Center's Sailing Program. A lesser percentage of the total amount will be put towards next year's regatta, and will hopefully allow us to continue to increase and enhance our offerings. Greg McGrath, Director of Sight Center's Sailing Program, was extremely surprised and elated when advised of our estimate donation, and he intends to use it to help maintain and/or purchase new equipment for their boats.

Throughout the weekend, many of the visiting participants expressed how great an experience they were having. A post-event review by the regatta committee and the GRSC board of trustees revealed a few minor opportunities for improvement (i.e. "glitches"), but a vastly greater majority of things that went well this year. If you have any comments, suggestions, or recommendations for next year, please let us know.

## LEADERSHIP LAKE COUNTY YOUTH SAILING ADVENTURE

The Leadership Lake County Youth Sailing Adventure held on September 12<sup>th</sup> was a terrific event. Six boats took out more than 35 students and LLC staff on what turned out to be a perfect morning for sailing – sunshine, blue skies, and a 10-15 knot southerly breeze. The event was designed to introduce the students from various Lake County high schools to each other; to instill the importance of first impressions and teamwork; and to introduce the students to sailing. Thanks to Donald Wayne McLeod for organizing the event and to all the skippers who volunteered their time and their boats.
